



The **RMLHS Federation** represents nineteen Wisconsin Evangelical Lutheran Synod churches who hold firmly to the inerrant Word of God. The following statements represent the doctrinal positions that will frame our teaching and decisions at **RMLHS**.

- We believe there is only one true God. He has made Himself known as the Triune God, one God in three persons. This is evident from Jesus' command to His disciples to baptize in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. (*John 17:3, Matthew 28:19*)
- We believe that God has made us and all creatures and that we have failed to live up to those things which God wants and requires of us. (*Colossians 1:16, Romans 3:23*)
- We believe that God is a merciful and gracious God who does not desire that any should perish. (*I Timothy 2:4*)
- We believe that, therefore, He sent His Son Jesus into the world to live a perfect life and to die an innocent death for us. (*John 3:16*)
- We believe that Jesus Christ, true God, begotten of the Father from eternity, and also true man, born of the Virgin Mary, is the only Savior from sin, death, and the power of the devil and that through Him we are reconciled to our heavenly Father and become His dear children. (*Acts 4:12, II Corinthians 5:19-21*)
- We believe that through faith in Jesus Christ, as promised to us in the Bible, a man is justified without the deeds of the Law and that his faith is a living force within a believer which produces works that are pleasing to God. (*Romans 3:28, John 15:5*)
- We believe that the Bible is the inspired Word of God. We reject any thought that makes only part of Scripture God's Word, or that allows for the possibility of factual error in Scripture, and also in so-called non-religious matters, e.g. historical, geographical, etc. (*II Timothy 3:16*)
- We believe that we receive through His Spirit the power to live new and changed lives devoted to Him and His glory. (*II Corinthians 5:17*)
- We believe that when this life is over, an eternal home is awaiting us in heaven. (*John 14:2-3*)

Application Fee

A non-refundable \$125.00 application fee must accompany each new student application within ten days of the date the application was received.

PAYMENT PLANS AND SCHEDULE

Annual: One payment due August 4, 2019.

Semi-Annual: Two 50% payments, due August 4, 2019 and January 6, 2020.

10 Payments: Ten equal monthly payments from August 2019 until May 2020.

12 Payments: Twelve equal monthly payments from August 2019 until July 2020.

DISCOUNTS AND FEES

Annual Plan Early Payment Discount: Students enrolling prior to August 4, 2019 and choosing the Annual Payment Plan are eligible for a \$150 discount, to be deducted at the time of the payment.

Semi-Annual Plan Discount: Students enrolling prior to August 4, 2019 and choosing the Semi-Annual Payment Plan are eligible for a \$50 discount, to be deducted from each half payment.

New Student Application Fee: A non-refundable fee of \$125 must accompany all new student applications.

Extracurricular Fees: There are individual sports fees that vary depending on the sport. There is also a fee to be a member of Eagle Choir.

****FACTS -** RMLHS uses FACTS, an automatic withdrawal system, to assist in making payments on time. All families are required to use this system unless making annual or semi-annual payments.

Does my family need to attend a certain church in order to go to school at RMLHS?

No, you do not need to attend a certain church in order for your child to attend our school. We look forward to sharing the principles of our faith with you.

Do students wear uniforms?

No, however, there is a dress code explained in our handbook.

What are the school hours?

All classes are Monday through Friday. The school doors open at 7:30am. Classes begin at 9:00am and are held until 3:30pm. Activities run from 3:45 until 5:30 pm. There is after school supervision until the end of sports practices.

Do you provide transportation?

Many of the families car pool. We can put you in touch with people in your area with whom you can make carpool arrangements. There are also two vans that will transport students to school in the mornings and return at the end of the day. The first van departs from Shepherd of the Valley Lutheran Church, Westminster (88th & Field St.) and the second from Lord of Life Lutheran Church, Thornton (120th & Colorado). There is a flat monthly fee to utilize van transportation.

Do students bring their own lunches?

Yes, we have a refrigerator in which to store lunch bags and drinks. Microwaves are available for student use. The school also arranges for lunches to be catered 1-2 times a week. Students sign up and pay cash, or families have the option of maintaining a lunch account with the school office.

Do you have an athletic program?

Yes, we compete with public and private schools through the Colorado High School Activities Association (CHSAA).

What financial help is available for tuition expenses?

Families can raise funds through a volunteer work program. The program allows you to donate your earnings towards your tuition by working concessions at sporting and entertainment venues. We also encourage you to check with your church and extended family members to see if there are funds available for Christian education. RMLHS does have a small Tuition Assistance Fund. Families must apply through FACTS Grant & Aid Assessment to request this aid.

May seniors graduate early?

No.

Do students have access to computers?

We are a one-to-one school. Each student supplies their own Chromebook as part of their school supplies.

Do you teach a foreign language?

Yes, we require two years of Spanish for graduation. Students are able to take a third year of Spanish as well. Seniors have the option to study other foreign languages through online courses.

Do you have a fine arts program?

Yes, art and musical instruments are required for all freshmen. Choir is required for all freshmen and sophomores. There are two drama productions performed each year. Drama, band, and Eagle Choir are extracurricular activities.

How many religious classes will my child take?

Bible classes are taught every day just like science and math. Students attend bi-weekly chapel services. All other classes in the curriculum are taught from a Christian perspective.

Do you have an open campus?

No, we have a closed campus policy. Students need permission to leave campus.

Do you have a school nurse?

No, not at this time.

Is there a discount if the entire tuition is paid up front?

Yes, a \$150 discount is given if a full year's tuition is paid by August 4, 2019. One \$50 discount is given with each half payment, made semi-annually; due August 4, 2019 and January 6, 2020.

How many students are currently attending RMLHS?

Currently, 58 students are enrolled at RMLHS.


We currently lease practice and game space in area facilities, but have plans for our own gym and athletic field in the future. Sports schedules are located on our website.



FINE ARTS

In order to provide a broad spectrum of educational experiences, RMLHS offers opportunities for students in the area of Fine Arts. In their freshman year, students are required to take courses in music and art. Freshmen and sophomores participate in choir. Students have the opportunity to continue in a select choir for their junior and senior years. Band is an extracurricular opportunity available to all students throughout their four years. All musical groups perform at the year-end Prism Concert.

There are two drama productions each year. In early fall the traveling children's theater performs a play at Lutheran elementary schools. The drama department performs a three-act play in the spring. Students audition for roles in each of these productions.



STUDENT GOVERNMENT

Students are given the opportunity to run for Student Senate. This group of students from all classes organizes the social events of the school year. They also have the privilege of organizing a variety of service days. In this way we hope to encourage young men and women to become better Christian leaders in their churches and communities.

CURRICULUM

RMLHS has a college prep curriculum that aligns itself with the entrance requirements of four year colleges in Colorado. Each year all students study the Word of God, mathematics, English, science and social studies. Additionally there are courses in music, technology, foreign languages, and physical education. Upperclassmen are able to take Honors and AP courses. We offer dual credit courses from Bethany Lutheran College of Mankato, MN.

RMLHS is a one device to one student (1:1) school. Each student is required to own a Chromebook to access online textbooks, teachers' online notes, and to submit assignments online.

ACCREDITATION

RMLHS is nationally accredited by the National Council for Private School Accreditation and the Wisconsin Evangelical Lutheran Synod School accreditation programs. Accreditation is an important step that ensures that our academic program meets or exceeds the high standards of education quality as mandated by these groups. RMLHS has pursued and maintained accreditation so that families can be confident in the educational excellence available at RMLHS and to open doors of opportunity for students to attend colleges that require graduation from an accredited school.

TEACHERS

The teachers of RMLHS are all members of the Wisconsin Evangelical Lutheran Synod and are either certified or working toward certification within our church body. Three-fourths of the staff possess or are in the process of obtaining advanced degrees in their fields. Our knowledgeable Christian faculty is able to challenge students academically, and also share the wonderful message of Jesus. Students consistently recognize that they learn under a faculty that cares about their personal and spiritual well-being.
